FIRST PITCH

- Kansas starts its 134th season of baseball on Friday in Corpus . Christi, Texas, against Illinois-Chicago at Whataburger Field. » This will be the third-straight year that Kansas opens
 - the season at Whataburger Field.
 - Kansas is 4-2 all-time at Whataburger Field.
 - Kansas is 20-7 in season openers since joining the Big 12
 - Conference prior to the start of the 1997 season.
 - » The Jayhawks began last season, and the first under Head Coach Dan Fitzgerald, with a 5-1 victory against Valparaiso.
 - Kansas went 2-1 on opening weekend a year ago. » Kansas returns six Opening Day starters from last season
- The 2024 roster is comprised of 22 returners and 20 newcomers (14 transfers, six freshmen).
 - » There are five players remaining on the roster from the 2022 season (Jake Baker, Jake English, Kolby Dougan, Chase Jans, Tyler Gerety).
- Kansas finished the 2023 season with a record of 25-32 and an 8-16 mark in Big 12 play.
 - » The Jayhawks doubled their conference win total and improved their overall win total by five games in 2023.
- Kansas gualified for the Big 12 Championship in 2023 for the first time since 2021 and won its first game in the tournament since 2019 with a 6-3 victory against No. 1-seeded Texas in the opening game.
 - » Janson Reeder hit a go-ahead grand slam in the 7th inning to break a 2-2 tie.
- · INF Kodey Shojinaga set a Kansas freshman record with a .378 batting average in 2023. He posted a .418 batting average and 41 hits in conference games (both a league best).
 - » Shojinaga was named a Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, the Big 12 Co-Freshman of the Year, received All-Big 12 Second Team and Big 12 All-Freshman Team honors. He became the first Kansas player to be awarded Big 12 Freshman of the Year.

TEAM NOTES

BEST TRANSFER CLASS IN THE BIG 12

D1Baseball ranked the Kansas transfer class as the No. 9 transfer class in the country and the best in the Big 12 on Jan. 9.

After receiving the No. 1-ranked junior college recruiting class in December 2022, Fitzgerald and his staff attacked the transfer portal following the 2023 season. With the combination of the five junior college transfers who received the No. 1 ranking and the eight transfers brought in this past summer, Kansas landed in the top 10 of D1Baseball's rankings.

DUTTON DEALING

RHP **Reese Dutton** was named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Preseason All-America Second Team, the organization announced on Feb. 6.

Dutton, a senior transfer from USC Upstate, went 10-3 with a 3.29 ERA over 90.1 innings pitched in 2023 for the Spartans. He had 102 strikeouts compared to 30 walks in 15 starts. Dutton set the single-season program record at USC Upstate with his 102 strikeouts and tied the single-season program record with 10 wins. He was one of 22 Division I pitchers with 10 or more wins in 2023.

Dutton is the third Jayhawk in program history to receive NCBWA Preseason All-America honors. He joins Tony Thompson in 2010 and Jonah Ulane in 2022, who each were named to the second team.

Dutton is expected to make a big impact on the mound for the Jayhawks in 2024.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

The Kansas duo of sophomore **Kodey Shojinaga** and senior **Janson Reeder** were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Baseball Team on Jan. 24.

Shojinaga, a freshman All-American and the Big 12 Co-Freshman of the Year in 2023, returns for his second season after setting a Kansas freshman record with a .378 batting average. He also posted a .418 batting average and recorded 41 hits in conference games, which were both a league best.

Reeder earned the preseason honor following a selection to the ABCA/ Rawlings All-Central Region Second Team and All-Big 12 First Team as a designated hitter a season ago. He led the team in slugging percentage (.558) and hit by pitches (10) and was tied for the most doubles (16) and triples (2) on the team.

COLLEGE FIRST

Freshman RHP **Dominic Voegele** was drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 20th round of the 2023 MLB Draft this past summer. However, he decided to come play at KU instead of signing a pro contract.

Voegele was ranked the No. 5 pitcher in the state of Illinois, and the No. 9 overall prospect in the state according to Prep Baseball Report. He was an all-state selection in 2022 and 2023.

ALL ABOUT GETTING BETTER

Under first-year coaching staff Dan Fitzgerald, Brandon Scott, Tyler Hancock and Jon Coyne, Kansas saw improvement as a team and individually. The staff helped increase the team's win total by five games overall and doubled the team's win total in conference play. Below are team comparisons from 2022 to 2023.

Kansas posted a batting average of .277 with 544 hits in 2023, which were both the most since 2014 (.283 with 583 hits). The 116 doubles, 361 runs and 340 RBIs were all the most since 2010, while the 201 extra-base hits marked the most since 2009 (205).

Kansas lowered its ERA by 1.75 runs per game in 2023. That is the biggest decrease from one season to the next since lowering the ERA by 1.84 runs per game from 2016 to 2017.

Kansas tied for first in the Big 12 with 46 double plays turned during the regular season (Texas). That also ranked 25th in the nation.

TEAM NOTES

SET TO LAUNCH

Kansas tied the program record with 75 home runs in 2023. The record was set in 2006. Kansas had four players with at least 10 home runs in 2023 (**Cole Elvis, Janson Reeder, Chase Jans, Jake English**). The last time Kansas had four players with double-digit home runs in a single season was 2003 (Casey Spanish, Travis Metcalf, Ryan Baty, Kevin Wheeler).

Kansas had 21 games with multiple home runs, which tied the program record from 2004. Kansas tied the program record for the most home runs hit in a game with seven on Feb. 26, 2023 vs. Oakland. The record was set in 1984.

2023 POSTSEASON AWARD WINNERS

BACK-TO-BACK BIG 12 SERIES WINS

Kansas won back-to-back Big 12 series at #19 West Virginia (April 7-9, 2023) and vs. Baylor (March 31-April 2, 2023) for the first time since the 2017 season (vs. Oklahoma State/at #19 Oklahoma).

The series at #19 West Virginia marked the first Big 12 series win on the road since March 23-25, 2018 at Baylor when the Jayhawks won two out of three games. It was also the first series win against a ranked opponent since sweeping No. 20 St. John's in 2018 and the first on the road since taking two-of-three against No. 19 Oklahoma in Norman in 2017. The series win in Morgantown was only the second time the Jayhawks have won a series there (2015).

Kansas beat West Virginia in the first two games, which marked the first time with back-to-back wins against a ranked opponent since April 21-22, 2017 at #19 Oklahoma.

Kansas had a season-long seven-game winning streak during this stretch from March 29-April 8, 2023. The sweep against Baylor was the first Big 12 series sweep since May 17-19, 2019 vs. K-State.

SHOJ TIME

INF **Kodey Shojinaga** posted the seventh highest regular season batting average (.378) amongst true freshman in Division I baseball in 2023. That helped him in being named a Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Freshman All-American, the Big 12 Co-Freshman of the Year, an All-Big 12 Second Team infielder and an All-Freshman Team unanimous selection.

Shojinaga led the team in batting average (.378), hits (74), multi-hit games (20), on-base percentage (.421) and OPS (.947), before earning an invite to training camp with USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team. He recorded a team-high 18-game hitting streak from April 16-May 18, 2023. Over the 18-game streak, he hit .418/.473/.519 with five doubles, one home run, nine RBIs, 21 runs and 10 walks.

MR. SPORTSCENTER

OF **Chase Jans** appeared on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays three separate times in 2023. Jans had the No. 2 play on April 14, 2023 vs. K-State, the No. 3 play on May 11, 2023 at Samford and the No. 7 play on May 24, 2023 vs. Texas.

Jans was selected to the All-Big 12 Second Team after a breakout 2023 season. The Overland Park native hit .314 with 13 doubles, 10 home runs and 50 RBIs. He finished second on the team in slugging percentage (.531), hits (65) and RBIs (50).

HITS FOR TEACHERS

INF **Michael Brooks** started a campaign prior to the start of the 2023 season to personally donate \$20 for every hit he had this season to Lawrence Schools Foundation to provide school supplies for teachers and students. He finished the 2023 season with 59 hits, making his donation \$1,180.

Brooks plans to continue the initiative for the 2024 season. He will continue donating \$20 for every hit and will make a \$40 donation for each home run.

After receiving the first-ever No. 1-ranked junior college recruiting class in program history in November 2022, less than five months after Fitzgerald and his staff were hired, the staff assembled another No. 1 JUCO recruiting class in November 2023.

The class from November 2022 will make their Kansas debuts this season and include: Cooper Combs (Johnson County Community College), Ben Hartl (Heartland Community College), Evan Shaw (Cochise College) and Patrick Steitz (Central Arizona College).

The most recent No. 1-ranked class will join the team for the 2024-25 academic year. That group features Maddox Burkitt (Johnson County Community College), Ángel Cano Orozco (Western Oklahoma State College), Kannon Carr (Jefferson College), Derek Cerda (Western Oklahoma State College), Porter Conn (Lincoln Land Community College), Brian Hallum (Dodge City Community College), Naun Haro (College of Southern Nevada) and TJ Williams (Heartland Community College).

SETTING RECORDS IN THE CLASSROOM

The baseball program set a record with a 3.61 GPA this past fall semester.

SERIES HISTORY

Kansas and Illinois-Chicago have a series that dates back to 1995. The Jayhawks hold a 9-1 advantage all-time in the series. Kansas won the first nine matchups in the series, which included scoring double-digit runs in each of the first six contests. Kansas has outscored Illinois-Chicago by a combined score of 114-36 in the 10 games.

UP NEXT

Kansas will play a midweek game on Tuesday, Feb. 20 at Whataburger Field against Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Then, Kansas will make the trip north to Round Rock, Texas, to play in the Karbach Round Rock Classic against Texas State, Washington State and Kentucky.

DAN FITZGERALD,

an elite recruiter, player developer, coach and ascending figure in college baseball, was named the Kansas Baseball Head Coach on June 15, 2022. Fitzgerald enters his second season with the Jayhawks in 2024.

In his first year directing the program, Kansas doubled its conference win total and improved its overall win total by five games. The Jayhawks qualified for the Big 12 Championship for the first time since 2021 and won their first game in the tournament since 2019, knocking off No. 1 Texas.

Offensively, Kansas tied the program record with 75 home runs in 2023, with four players hitting at least 10 home runs for the first time since 2003. The Jayhawks also posted their highest batting average and most hits since 2014, while they also tallied their most doubles, runs and RBIs since 2010.

On the mound, Kansas lowered its ERA by 1.75 runs per game from 2022 to 2023. Defensively, Kansas tied for first in the Big 12 with 46 double plays turned during the regular season. That also ranked 25th in the nation.

Under Fitzgerald and his staff, Collin Baumgartner and Cole Elvis both went on to sign professional contracts following the 2023 season. Baumgartner and Elvis each transferred to Kansas to utilize their final year of eligibility.

Fitzgerald and his staff have had success on the recruiting trail since coming to Lawrence. In November 2022, less than five months after Fitzgerald and his staff were hired, they assembled the No. 1 JUCO recruiting class. The No. 1 ranking by Perfect Game was the Jayhawks' first-ever top ranked recruiting class. The staff followed that up by earning the No. 1 JUCO recruiting class for a second consecutive year in November 2023. An aggressive approach to the transfer portal also earned Kansas the No. 9-ranked transfer class and the best in the Big 12 by D1Baseball in January 2024.

Fitzgerald arrived at Kansas following one year at LSU in 2022, where he served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator, helping lead the Tigers to a 40win season and an NCAA Regional final appearance. His time in Baton Rouge was preceded by a successful nine-year tenure at Dallas Baptist as both an assistant coach, associate head coach and recruiting coordinator.

At DBU, Fitzgerald had a major hand in bringing unprecedented success to the Patriots program. In his nine seasons with the program, Dallas Baptist played in seven NCAA Regionals, won three regular-season conference championships and won three conference tournaments.

Fitzgerald came to Lawrence with a sterling reputation in player development and recruiting, along with deep Midwestern ties, having served as a head coach at Des Moines Area Community College for five seasons and spending five seasons as an assistant in the region.

During his nine seasons at Dallas Baptist (2012-21), Fitzgerald played a major role in the Patriots developing and recruiting some of the top talent in the country. He helped recruit and develop 57 Major League Baseball Draft picks, 20 of those being Top-10 picks, nine All-Americans, eight freshman All-Americans, 80 all-conference selections and two conference players of the year.

Dallas Baptist tallied 270 victories from 2015-21, which was the fifth-most by a Division I baseball program during that span. The Patriots, known best for their explosive offense, ranked in the top 25 nationally in home runs in each season during Fitzgerald's time at Dallas Baptist. The team held a top 25 ranking in a total of 51 offensive categories across his nine seasons.

With the Patriots proving to be one of the top programs nationally, Fitzgerald was promoted from assistant coach to associate head coach in June 2016. Dallas Baptist posted a 341-168 (.670) record during his tenure with six seasons of at least 40 wins. Fitzgerald helped land some of the top prep players nationally, by being able to recruit throughout the country, thanks to his trusted relationships and proven track record, which he now brings to Kansas.

Fitzgerald has earned respect among his peers. In a survey of 90 head coaches conducted by Baseball America in 2020, Fitzgerald was rated No. 7 on a list of assistant coaches from across the nation that will one day make the best head coach. Baseball America also rated Fitzgerald as the No. 7 assistant coach in the nation in 2018, while D1Baseball ranked him as the 17th-best recruiter in the country in 2016.

Prior to his time at LSU and Dallas Baptist, Fitzgerald was the head coach at Des Moines Area Community College (2008-12). In his five years at DMACC, Fitzgerald was awarded Coach of the Year honors by 13 different publications. His team's won five consecutive conference championships and advanced to the Junior College World Series on four separate occasions.

Fitzgerald also had 36 players sign with Division I programs, nine student-athletes be named Junior College All-Americans, including the 2009 National Player of the Year. His program finished with at least 40 wins in every season and compiled a 249-73 (.773) record over the five-year stretch.

Fitzgerald's coaching career began in 2000 at lowa as a volunteer assistant coach. He then interned with the Minnesota Twins scouting department (2002) before returning to coaching as an assistant at North Iowa Area Community College (2003-04), Flagler College (2005-06) and Des Moines Area Community College (2007-08).

In addition to coaching at schools, Fitzgerald has spent time as a head coach in top summer leagues around the country. That includes a stint in 2004 as the Field Manager for Athletes in Action in Alaska, the sport ministry of Campus Crusade for Christ.

A native of Edina, Minnesota, Fitzgerald attended and played baseball at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota, and the University of Wisconsin-River Falls before graduating with a degree in English from the University of Minnesota in 2000. Most recently, he earned a Masters of Education in Kinesiology from Dallas Baptist in 2016. Fitzgerald and his wife, Kelly, have three sons – Will, Max and Ben.

NEW ERA OF KANSAS BASEBALL

Head Coach Dan Fitzgerald was named the new leader of Kansas Baseball on June 15, 2022. Since taking over the program, Kansas has started to build a foundation for the future. Below is a timeline of program accomplishments under Fitzgerald and his coaching staff.
