- **University of Missouri** baseball kicks off a five-game road swing Tuesday (March 12) with the first of two nonconference meetings with **Kansas** at Hoglund Ballpark in Lawrence, Kan.
- The Tigers, who will play the Jayhawks next Tuesday at Kauffman Stadium in Kansas City as well, bring a sizable 219-129-2 overall series advantage into this year's first meeting with KU.
- MU has won three straight meetings with Kansas and holds a 68-52 advantage vs. the Jayhawks in Lawrence.
- Tuesday's game will be Mizzou's final nonconference tuneup before opening the 2024 SEC season this weekend against No. 2 Arkansas in Fayetteville.

- Tuesday's contest will be streamed live on **ESPN+** with **Steven Davis** and **Kevin Wheeler** calling the action.
- Every Missouri baseball game in 2024 will be produced by the **Tiger Radio Network** and streamed live via the **Varsity Network** app, with **Tex Little** and **Matt Michaels** once again handling broadcast duties.

MIZZOU MOMENT

March 11, 2001...Mizzou blanked Kansas by a 1-0 score, as the trio of **Shaun Marcum**, **Pete Sansone** and **Ryan Stegall** held the Jayhawks to six hits in a pitchers' duel that gave the Tigers a series win over their rivals.

The Tigers plated the game's lone run in the seventh inning. With one out, **Kurt Propst** singled to center field. **W.T. Hoover** entered the game as a pinch-runner for Propst and stole second base. **Wes Fewell** walked to bring up **Luke Cassis**, who doubled to center to score Hoover.

Stellar defensive play allowed MU to make the run stand. In the ninth, the Tigers turned a 5-4-3 double play to end the game, after Kansas put runners on first and third with one out. The twin-killing gave Stegall his third save of the season and Marcum his first collegiate victory after tossing four hitless innings to start the game.

SERIES HISTORY

- Tuesday's game will mark the 351st meeting of the Tigers and Jayhawks.
- Mizzou holds a 219-129-2 all-time edge over KU.
- The Tigers have won 68 of the 120 games played in the series in Lawrence, but just one of the last seven contests at Hoglund Ballpark (dating back to 2010).
- Last year, the Tigers claimed an 8-3 win over KU at Kauffman Stadium (March 22) in Kansas City, before finishing the season sweep with a 9-7 victory in Columbia (May 2).
- Offense has been the story in the last seven games in the series, with the Tigers averaging 9.4 runs per outing in going 5-2 vs. the Jayhawks.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

- Missouri posted a 30-24 regular-season finish last spring, including a 10-20 SEC mark.
- Kerrick Jackson** was named the 15th head coach in Mizzou history in June, returning to Columbia to lead a program for which he served as an assistant coach from 2011-15 under Mizzou Hall of Fame head coach (and current pitching coach) **Tim Jamieson**.
- The Tigers return three regular starters from last season, led by senior INF/OF **Trevor Austin**, who batted .311 with eight homers and 10 steals to help bolster the MU offense.
- Senior INF **Matt Garcia** turned in a solid debut season with the Tigers, providing clutch hitting and lock-down defense on the MU infield.
- Additionally, junior INF **Justin Colon** returns for Mizzou and earning significant playing time at shortstop over each of his first two seasons in Columbia.
- MU should also receive a lift from sophomore INF **Jackson Lovich** and junior OF **Juju Stevens**, who each made key contributions in limited duty in 2023.
- Several newcomers could also make early contributions, including junior INF **Danny Corona**, who helped Wake Forest to a 2023 College World Series berth, C **Jedier Hernandez**, a standout behind the plate for Seton Hall the last two seasons, and sophomore OF **Jeric Curtis**, a Texas Tech transfer who brings significant speed to the Tiger outfield and batting order.
- On the mound, sophomore RHP **Logan Lunceford** is back to help anchor Mizzou's weekend rotation after posting 68 strikeouts to lead all SEC freshman hurlers last spring.
- Junior LHP **Javyn Pimental** also contributed mightily to the Tigers' mound efforts in 2023, making eight starts for the Tigers.
- Mizzou should also benefit from the potential return of a pair of veterans who missed significant time last spring; LHP **Ian Lohse** and RHP **Carter Rustad** missed significant portions of 2023 due to injury following promising starts to the campaign.
- New arms like RHP **Xavier Lovett** and RHP **Bryce Mayer** could compete for starting rotation spots, while RHP **Jacob Peaden** may give the back end of the Tigers' bullpen a strong presence.

MIZZOU BY THE NUMBERS

- Missouri is coming off a 30-win campaign last spring, which marked the 20th time the Tigers reached the 30-win plateau in the last 30 seasons, as well as the 35th time overall.
- 1B **Jackson Lovich** leads the Tigers with 19 RBIs and brings a career-best 11-game hit streak into Tuesday's contest.

- Lovich has reached base safely via a hit or walk in all 16 contests this season and is hitting .395 over the course of his current hit streak that dates back to February 24.
- LHP **Daniel Wissler** struck out a career-best five hitters in his last start, March 5 vs. Lindenwood.
- INF **Justin Colon** registered his first four-hit game as a Tiger vs. Northern Kentucky (March 3). The junior also posted career bests for runs scored (4) and RBIs (5) vs. NKU.
- 2B **Trevor Austin** leads the club with seven home runs after binging on Purdue Fort Wayne pitching with four round-trippers in four games last weekend.
- Austin has been red-hot over the last 10 games, hitting .412 (14-for-34) with five homers and 13 RBIs, as well as an OPS of 1.535.
- OF **Jackson Beaman** has been lethal at the plate over the same stretch as well, batting .500 (7-for-14) with three round-trippers, 12 RBIs and a club-leading .680 on-base percentage.
- C **Jedier Hernandez** has gunned down three would-be basestealers on the season.
- RHP **Ben Pedersen** logged three consecutive scoreless relief outings as part of his return from a two-year absence due to injuries. The 6-foot-6 Minnesota native has allowed just two hits over a combined 4.0 innings to date.
- OF **Thomas Curry** enjoyed a debut to remember at Cal Poly, as the freshman paced all Mizzou hitters with his .444 average, while homering and driving in four runs.
- RHP **Carter Rustad** notched career victory No. 15 Saturday with 6.0 strong innings in MU's win over PFW.
- Over their last 21 1/3 combined innings, Mizzou starting pitchers have posted a 1.26 ERA.
- As a team, Mizzou has been hit by 35 pitches this season, good for fourth in the SEC.
- RHP **Jacob Peaden** shares the SEC lead for saves (3 and ranks second in games finished (5).
- The Tigers rank fourth in the conference in stolen bases (21) as well, led by OF **Jeric Curtis'** five steals.
- In their last 16 home games at Taylor Stadium dating back to May 2, 2023, the Tigers have hit .335 (175-for-523) as a team with 42 home runs, while averaging 11.0 runs per contest.
- All 13 Mizzou hitters who came to the plate in Sunday's 20-2 rout of Purdue Fort Wayne recorded at least one hit, while seven different Tigers drove in multiple runs in the victory.
- In its 28-10 rout of Northern Kentucky on March 2, Mizzou scored 14 times in the first inning, marking its biggest rally since 2005.
- The Tigers' 28 runs in the victory not only marked the most for an SEC squad this season, but also represented their top single-game total since a 28-2 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on March 24, 2010.

SCOUTING KANSAS

- Under second-year head coach **Dan Fitzgerald**, the Jayhawks are off to a 9-5 start after taking two of three from No. 3 TCU to open the Big 12 season over the weekend.
- The Jayhawks are hitting .310 as a team, as the duo of OF **Lenny Ashby** (.375) and C **Jake English** (.357) have combined for 11 home runs and 28 RBIs to lead KU.
- On the hill, KU has fashioned a 4.39 ERA, led by RHP **Patrick Steitz's** 0.96 mark.
- RHP **Hunter Cranton** has been KU's most dependable arm out of the bullpen, logging seven consecutive scoreless outings to start the season.

HOME COOKIN'

- Mizzou has found the friendly confines of Taylor Stadium much to its liking over a recent offensive surge spanning the last seven home games of the 2023 campaign and its first nine home contests of the new season.
- Since May 2 of last year, the Tigers have hit .335 as a team while homering 42 times and averaging 11.0 runs per outing.
- Over the same stretch, Mizzou has scored in double-digits nine times and registered at least 10 hits 10 times in going 10-6 at Taylor.
- 2B **Trevor Austin** has been the key linchpin in the Tigers' power surge at Taylor, clubbing seven of MU's 42 home runs over the 16-game span.

LOVIN' LOVICH

- 1B **Jackson Lovich** will bring a career-best 11-game hit streak into Tuesday's game.
- The sophomore from Overland Park, Kan., is hitting .357 (17-for-43) with four of his five home runs on the season and 15 RBIs during the same stretch.
- Lovich has slugged .721 for the season and has reached base safely via a hit or walk in all 16 contests in 2024.
- He also leads the Tigers in multi-hit (7) and multi-RBI (6) games and ranks 14th in the SEC in hitting (.377).

WELCOME MATT

- INF **Matt Garcia** barely missed a beat in his two-week absence due to injury to start the 2024 season, logging a 2-for-3 afternoon in his first start of the year March 5 in Mizzou's win over Lindenwood.
- The Orlando, Fla., product reached base in three of his four trips to the plate, including back-to-back singles and a stolen base.
- Since Garcia's return to the Tigers lineup, the Mizzou offense has hit .329 and averaged 10.0 runs per game.
- Garcia started 37 games on the Tigers infield in his first season with Mizzou last spring and will once again provide a defensive anchor for MU after fielding at a .977 clip in 2023.

TARGET: TREVOR

- 2B **Trevor Austin** has made a habit of reaching base throughout his four-year career with the Tigers, particularly when it comes to serving as a target, logging 37 free bases due to hit by pitches.
- Austin, the SEC's active leader in HBPs, was hit by a pitch four times during Mizzou's initial home stand of the season, running his 2024 total to eight HBPs, which ranks third in the SEC.
- As a result, the Jefferson City native has climbed to fourth on Mizzou's career HBP chart, passing **Brock Bond** and **Dan Opel** on March 5 when he was hit by a

- pitch in the seventh inning of MU's 5-4 victory over Lindenwood.
- Austin is six HBPs away from matching **Jacob Priday's** career total of 43 in the No. 3 position on the list.
- John McKee** (2004-07) owns the Tigers' all-time mark of 70 HBPs, and **John Hay** (1989-93) ranks second with 51 HBPs.

FRESH LOOK

- Mizzou has received contributions from up and down its roster, but the Tigers' talented crop of freshmen have been perhaps their most consistent performers.
- MU's four primary freshman position players — SS **Drew Culbertson**, OF **Thomas Curry**, OF **Tucker Moore** and OF **Kaden Peer** — each rank among the Tigers' top batters offensive contributors.
- The quartet has combined to hit .275 (50-for-182) with four homers and seven stolen bases (in seven attempts) through 16 games.
- Culbertson has logged three multi-hit outings to date, hitting .273 overall while starting 11 games at shortstop.
- Moore has spent time in the leadoff spot in the MU batting order, recording four multi-hit performances and reaching base safely in 13 of his 15 games.
- Curry has hit a pair of homers and notched four multi-RBI efforts, while drawing a team-best 10 walks.
- Peer has heated up as well, registering his first three-hit effort Sunday vs. Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Additionally, C **Mateo Serna** has contributed at the plate, driving in three runs in last week's victory over Lindenwood. The Florida native doubled in his first at-bat as a Tiger at Cal Poly (Feb. 17) and has made seven starts behind the plate for MU.

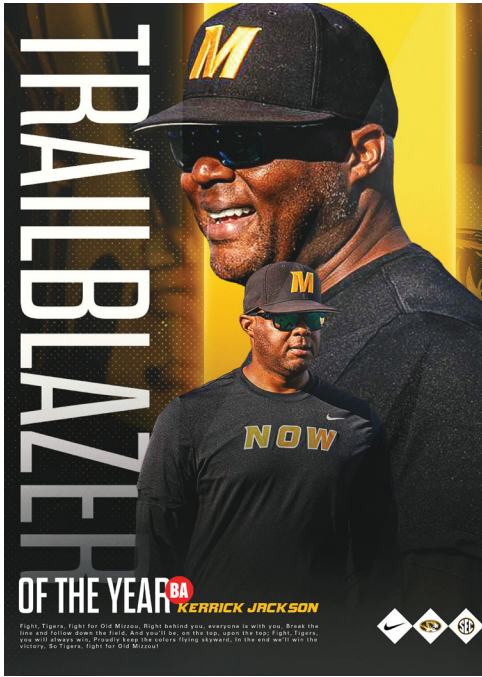

A HUB FOR MID-MISSOURI

- The University of Missouri generates \$5 billion in economic impact for the state of Missouri.
- The larger University of Missouri System, comprised of four universities, generated \$6.5 billion in economic impact on the Show Me State.
- The University of Missouri supports nearly 50,000 direct and indirect jobs, both full and part time, in the state.
- Mizzou Athletics generated \$319.1 million in economic impact over the last fiscal year.
- The Tigers support and sustain 3,591 jobs annually.
- Mizzou Athletics has generated \$15.9 million in state and local taxes.



WELCOME WAGON

- Nineteen different players have made their Mizzou debuts over the first four weeks of the season.
- In the Tigers season opener at Cal Poly, seven newcomers found their names in the lineup: RHP **Bryce Mayer**, 3B **Danny Corona**, C **Jedier Hernandez**, DH **Thomas Curry**, CF **Jeric Curtis**, SS **Drew Culbertson** and LF **Tucker Moore**.
- On the mound, several new faces contributed to the Tigers' series win, with LHP **Ryan Magdic** and RHP **Jacob Peaden** combining for 4.0 hitless innings of relief in a 3-1 victory, while RHP **Charlie Miller** and C **Mateo Serna** also saw action in game three.
- Last week, OF **Kaden Peer** made a pair of starts in the outfield, while RHP **Kaden Jacobi**, RHP **Victor Quinn** and RHP **Josh McDevitt** all made their first appearances for the Tigers in San Diego.
- On MU's recently completed home stand, four more newcomers have introduced themselves to the Mizzou faithful: RHP **Miles Garrett** made his debut as a Tiger vs. SEMO, before RHP **Xavier Lovett** and OF **RJ Jimerson** made their first appearances for vs. NKU (March 2) and RHP **Ben Smith** worked an inning in Sunday's series finale with Purdue Fort Wayne.

ROAD TO REDEMPTION

- RHP **Miles Garrett** is one of two MU hurlers returning from lengthy absences due to injuries. RHP **Ben Pedersen** also returned from a lengthy absence February 24 with his first mound appearance for the Tigers since May 15, 2021.
- Both Garrett and Pedersen missed all of the 2022 and 2023 seasons due to their injuries.
- Pedersen has been nearly untouchable so far in 2024, logging scoreless outings in three of those. In two of his three outings at Taylor Stadium, he worked hitless innings vs. SEMO (Feb. 27) and NKU (March 3).

NON-CON DOMINATION

- Mizzou has claimed eight nonconference victories over the first four weeks of the season, continuing a string of recent dominance in nonconference play.
- The Tigers logged a 20-3 mark against non-SEC foes last spring, after going 18-3 in nonconference play in 2022.
- MU has an overall mark of 46-14 in non-SEC competition since the start of the 2022 season.
- Over the last decade, the Tigers' dominance has been equally as pronounced, with MU winning nearly 100 more nonconference games than it has lost (173-74), good for a .700 winning percentage.

NOW THAT'S A RALLY

- Mizzou utilized a first-inning rally of historic proportions to log its first home victory of 2024 — a 28-10 rout of Northern Kentucky (March 2).
- The Tigers sent 17 batters to the plate in scoring 14 runs in the opening frame, marking their biggest inning since a 17-run rally vs. Texas Tech on April 1, 2005.
- In that 25-0 win over Texas Tech, current Tiger assistant coach **Bryson LeBlanc** factored prominently in the Tigers' key rally, walking twice and scoring before grounding out in a second inning that saw 23 MU hitters come to the plate.

TIGERS AT THE TURNSTILES

- Mizzou shattered its program record for total home attendance last spring, drawing 37,133 fans over 23 dates to eclipse the previous program mark of 31,450 (2008).
- MU finished its 2023 home campaign with its 20th crowd of 1,000 or more fans — and its 17th in a row.
- Mizzou ran its streak of consecutive crowds of 1,000 or more to 21 in a row (until March 5).
- In its 23 home dates at Taylor Stadium, the Tigers drew five crowds of at least 2,000 fans, as well as an average of 1,614 spectators per date, both of which represent high-water marks for the program.
- Last season's attendance growth marked a 43-percent increase in average home attendance from the 2022 season, when MU drew 1,127 fans per home date (and 28,181 for the entire season).

TIGER TRAILBLAZER

- Kerrick Jackson** has already enjoyed a personal moment of 'NOW' as the St. Louis product became the first Black head coach in SEC history with his appointment to the Tigers' top job.
- Jackson also picked up a significant honor from *Baseball America* in December, earning the publication's 2023 Trailblazer of the Year honor.
- Jackson has left his mark in just four seasons as a Division I head coach, including leading Southern to the 2019 Southwestern Athletic Conference crown and an NCAA Regional berth, as well as guiding Memphis to its first winning season in six years last spring.
- Additionally, Jackson has impacted the college baseball landscape through his work on the American Baseball Coaches Association's Diversity in Baseball Committee, a body for which he has served as chairman since its creation in 2018. The council works to improve diversity in the coaching ranks through a professional development program and an increased focus on youth baseball.

TIGERS IN THE MLB DRAFT

- Four 2023 Missouri baseball standouts continued the Tigers' tradition of professional talent production with their selections in the MLB Draft in July.
- P **Chandler Murphy** was taken by Tampa Bay in the

12th round (363rd overall), before 3B **Luke Mann** was picked by Oakland in the 14th round (406th overall) on the final day of the draft.

The two selections doubled Mizzou's 2023 crop of draftees to a total of four, joining fourth-round selection P **Austin Troesser** (New York Mets) and P **Zach Franklin** (Chicago White Sox), who were picked on day two of the draft.

IN THE 'NOW'

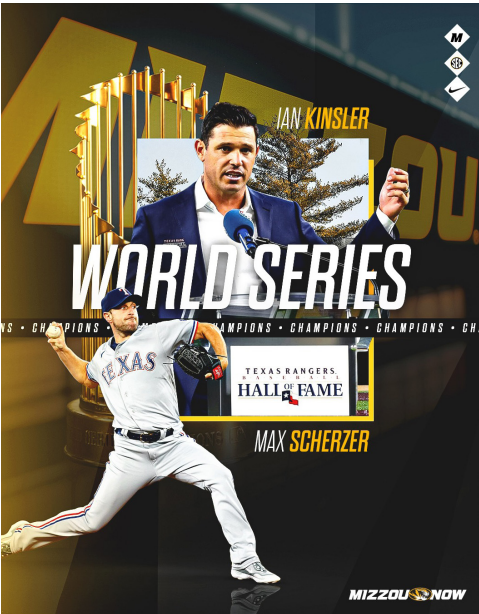
- New Tiger bench boss **Kerrick Jackson** has undertaken the challenge of revitalizing Missouri's tradition-rich program, part of which has included a re-branding of sorts.
- Casual observers of any number of Mizzou's fall or preseason workouts will undoubtedly have taken note of a new and unique slogan around Taylor Stadium. Jackson and his staff introduced the **#MizzouNOW** branding — an acronym for No Opportunity Wasted — providing his student-athletes an entirely new way of approaching the game and the way they go about working to achieve their common goal of returning Mizzou to national prominence.
- #MizzouNOW** was developed with a focus on appreciating the present and working toward taking advantage the opportunities immediately in front of the Tigers.

GOING DEEP

- Mizzou powered up to hit nine home runs last week and has now out-homered the opposition, 24-16.
- The Tigers are 7-5 when hitting at least one home run and 1-3 when they fail to go deep.
- Eleven different Tigers have homered in the first 16 games, continuing a recent trend that was evident in 2023, when 14 different Tigers hit at least one homer.
- 2B **Trevor Austin** and 1B **Jackson Lovich** have powered the early attack for MU. Austin clubbed three homers in four games at the Tony Gwynn Legacy series (Feb. 22-24), then pounded four balls out of the yard in this past weekend's series with PFW.
- Lovich blasted his fifth homer of the season Sunday vs. PFW.
- Austin has produced a pair of two-homer games, first in a 6-3 win over CSUB (Feb. 22), as well as this past Saturday's 11-1 victory over PFW.
- Two Tigers—SS **Drew Culbertson** and OF **Isaiah Frost** — hit their first collegiate home runs as part of a three-homer barrage by the Tigers in the second inning vs. CSUB.
- The long ball for Frost not only represented his first HR as a Tiger, but also his first hit.
- In their last 29 games, extending back to April 29, 2023, 19 different Tigers have combined to hit 57 round-trippers.
- In their last 16 games at Taylor Stadium, the Tigers have gone deep a mind-boggling 42 times.
- MU clubbed 79 homers in 2023, which represented the program's top total since the 1998 squad blasted a school-record 110 bombs.
- Mizzou reached the 75-home run plateau on just four previous occasions — 1998, 1988, 1986 and 1985.

COMING HOME

- Head coach **Kerrick Jackson** did not have to look far when adding the initial pieces of his Mizzou coaching staff. He selected former Tiger head coach **Tim Jamieson** for his pitching coach, completing a homecoming for the Mizzou Athletics Hall of Famer.
- Jamieson brings 28 years of coaching experience on the Missouri campus into his new role as the Tigers pitching coach.
- In 22 seasons as Mizzou's head baseball coach, Jamieson led the Tigers to 698 wins, trailing only **Gene McArtor** (733) on MU's coaching wins list.
- He coached eight All-Americans at Mizzou and saw 75 of his players drafted, including 19 Major Leaguers.
- Jamieson returns to his hometown of Columbia after serving as pitching coach under Jackson in his lone season at Memphis, where the duo helped lead the Tigers to their first winning season since 2017.
- Prior to his stop at UM, Jamieson spent three seasons (2020-22) as pitching coach at Southern Illinois, helping the Salukis compile a 96-42 record.
- Jamieson garnered 1996 Big 8 Coach of the Year and 2007 Big 12 Co-Coach of the Year honors, as his Missouri teams won 35 games or more nine times during his head coaching career.
- He led Mizzou to seven consecutive NCAA postseason appearances from 2003 to 2009, including the program's first Super Regional berth in 2006. He was also selected to lead USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team as head coach in 2011.
- Jamieson, a graduate of Columbia Rock Bridge High School, is married to a Mizzou graduate, the former Cindy Thornton.

SPEAKING OF HOMECOMINGS...

- Another new Mizzou assistant coach (and former Tiger) is making a return to his old stomping grounds. **Bryson LeBlanc** joined Jamieson on **Kerrick Jackson's** first MU staff after spending five seasons on the coaching staff at UC San Diego.
- LeBlanc, who was named one of D1Baseball.com's picks for its '100 Assistant Coaches Athletic Directors Should Know' list this past fall, patrolled the MU outfield for Jamieson on the previously mentioned 2006 Regional-winning club.
- He helped guide UC San Diego through its transition to the NCAA Division I level, including a 34-18 campaign last spring that culminated in the program's first Big West Conference title.
- In all, 46 of LeBlanc's former players have been selected in the MLB Draft, including 14 who have been taken in the top 10 rounds. Six of those have advanced to the big leagues.

HALL WORTHY

- Even before his return as a member of the Tigers' new coaching staff, **Tim Jamieson** knew he'd be making a trip to Columbia in 2023 after his selection for induction to the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in late May.
- Jamieson became the fourth former Tiger head baseball coach to be tabbed for Mizzou's highest athletic honor, joining **Don Faurot**, **John 'Hi' Simmons** and **Gene McArtor**.
- Jamieson took the Tigers to a Big Eight Conference championship in 1996, completing a worst-to-first turnaround – the first in Big Eight history – and in 2012 the Tigers won the Big 12 Conference Tournament title.
- Overall, he took nine teams to the NCAA Tournament, including seven straight appearances from 2003-09 and a Super Regional trip in 2006.

SHOW-ME STATE TO THE SHOW

- Tiger great P **Max Scherzer** claimed his second World Series title with the Texas Rangers' first world championship in a five-game series with Arizona.
- Scherzer became the fourth Tiger to earn multiple World Series championships, adding to his 2019 title with Washington.
- Another former Mizzou stalwart, Rangers special assistant to the G.M. **Ian Kinsler** (2003), also claimed his second World Series ring with the victory, following his first title as an active player with Boston in 2018.
- In all, eight Mizzou baseball alums have won World Series titles as players: in addition to Kinsler (2018) and Scherzer (2019 and 2023), **Homer Summa** (1929 and 1930), **Darold Knowles** (1973 and 1974), **Mike Shannon** (1964 and 1967), **Glenn Wright** (1925), **Charlie James** (1964) and **Tim Laudner** (1987) also claimed Fall Classics.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

- Missouri is slated to appear in eight linear broadcasts on the ESPN family of networks over the course of the 2024 season.
- Mizzou's SEC matchups and select non-conference games will stream on SEC Network+.
- Tuesday's contest with Kansas will be streamed live on ESPN+.

KERRICK JACKSON

FIRST YEAR • NEBRASKA '99

A veteran coach with experience at all levels of baseball, **Kerrick Jackson** was tabbed as Missouri's 15th head coach in June 2023.

Since that time, Jackson has undertaken the challenge of revitalizing the Tigers' tradition-rich program. These efforts have included hiring a diverse staff, recruiting a new-look roster and providing his pupils an entirely new way of approaching the game—and the way they go about working to achieve their common goal of returning Mizzou to national prominence.

While the work is well underway, Jackson will officially become the first Black Southeastern Conference head baseball coach to lead his team into action when the Tigers open their 2024 campaign in February. Furthermore, he will be just the fourth Black collegiate coach to guide a Power Five baseball program and the first to do so since the 2021 season.

In recognition of these efforts, *Baseball America* named Jackson its 2023 Trailblazer of the Year in December, capping an already historic year for the new Mizzou coach.

In addition to his success on the diamond as a collegiate coach, including leading Southern University to the 2019 Southwestern Athletic Conference crown and an NCAA Regional berth and guiding the University of Memphis to its first winning season in six years last spring, Jackson continues to serve as a relentless advocate for minorities in college baseball, especially in the coaching ranks. He helped form the American Baseball Coaches Association's Diversity in Baseball Committee and has served as its chairman since its creation in 2018. That body works to improve diversity in the coaching ranks through a professional development program and an increased focus on youth baseball.

Jackson returned to Columbia after having served as a Mizzou assistant from 2011-15. Known as a developer of players, a tireless recruiter, and a strong talent evaluator, Jackson is a well-respected leader in baseball circles, serving on the American Baseball Coaches Association Board of Directors and as chair of their Diversity in Baseball committee.

Prior to his season at Memphis, Jackson was the President of the MLB Draft League from 2020-22, a six-team summer baseball league sponsored by Major League Baseball and featuring a split-season amateur-professional format.

Jackson served as the head coach at Southern University from 2018-20, where he took a nine-win team in 2018 to 32 wins, a conference championship, and the NCAA Tournament the following season, earning SWAC and Louisiana Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year accolades. His 2018 Jaguar team boasted the athletic department's highest men's team GPA and received national recognition for its community service efforts.

Jackson worked for the Boras Corporation as a certified player agent for two years from 2016-17, where he identified prep and college players with the best chance to develop into Major League talent.

He served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Mizzou from 2011-15, working with the Tigers' hitters, outfielders, and infielders. Mizzou made back-to-back trips to the Big 12 Conference Tournament Championship in 2011-12, culminating with the program's first Big 12 title in 2012. The Tigers had multiple nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including 24th in 2012, 12th in 2014 and a consensus Top-30 class in 2015.

Before heading to Missouri, Jackson served as the Midwest Area Scouting Supervisor for the Washington Nationals from 2008-10, overseeing Missouri, Kansas, Arkansas, Iowa, Nebraska and the Dakotas.

His other collegiate coaching stops include assistant stints at St. Louis Community College-Meramec (2008), Nicholls State (2006-07), Jefferson (Mo.) College (2004-05), Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College (2003),



Emporia State (2002) and Fairfield (2001). Jackson also has extensive experience in the summer collegiate leagues, as he has coached in the Cape Cod League and New England Collegiate Baseball League.

Jackson spent two years at St. Louis Community College-Meramec as a student-athlete, where the team finished third at the JUCO World Series in 1995. Following that, he played at Bethune-Cookman University in 1996, leading the squad to its first-ever conference championship and regional appearance. Jackson concluded his playing career at Nebraska in 1997, graduating in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Jackson and his wife, Talia, have two sons, Zion and Lazarus.

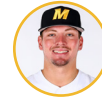
